From 8-13 July 2012, IUFRO Division 5 "Forest Products", together with the Technical University of Lisbon/ISA organized a most successful all-Division 5 Conference in Estoril, Portugal. The focus of IUFRO Division 5 is on forest products, their processing, finishing, logistics and recycling and includes the use of plantation wood and non-wood forest products. All these topics were well represented in the agenda which was organized along the overriding themes of: Forests for People, Forests and Climate Change, Bioenergy, Resources for the Future, and Wood in Construction as well as Cork and Sustainability.

Portugal was a perfect conference venue not only in terms of excellent logistics and a beautiful setting, it is also a country where forest and forest products research is strongly developed and anchored in universities and R&D centres that focus not only on nationally relevant issues but also on the leading international scientific themes. Moreover, with the previous two All-Division 5 conferences held in Rotorua (2003) and Taipei (2007), respectively, the venue offered an especially good opportunity for European scientists to attend and exchange their knowledge.

The environmental footprint of major conferences is increasingly gaining in importance worldwide. This was another reason why Division 5 chose the Congress Centre of Estoril (CCE). The conference building with its wood, steel and glass construction has been certified by Green Globe International, a recognized sustainability assessment brand.

The chair of the local organizing committee, Helena Pereira, Vice-rector of the Technical University of Lisbon, full professor of ISA (School of Agronomy), and president secretary of the Forest Research Centre/ Centro de Estudos Florestais (CEF), opened the conference and addressed, among other things, the difficulties that



teaching and research at universities and research institutions were currently facing in the fields of forest and wood science mainly in view of economic problems. Division 5 Coordinator Andrew Wong also welcomed the audience and looked ahead to the 2014 IUFRO World Congress (Salt Lake City) which will offer an excellent opportunity for forest products and related research worldwide to showcase its achievements.

The main message of the opening ceremony that was reflected throughout the entire conference referred to the need of research to meet rapidly increasing demands for a variety of forest products while maintaining forests as a source of such products and a resource that also offers social, economic and environmental benefits.

1st Brazilian Meeting on Forest Mensuration (MENSUFLOR)

Diamantina, Minas Gerais (MG), Brazil

Report by Gilciano Saraiva Nogueira, Federal University of Jequitinhonha and Mucuri Valleys/UFVJM, Deputy Coordinator <u>4.01.02</u> – Growth models for tree and stand simulation

The 1st Brazilian Meeting on Forest Mensuration (MENSUFLOR) was held on 9-10 August, 2012 at the Federal University of Jequitinhonha and Mucuri Valleys/ UFVJM. It was organized by professors and graduate students from the area of Forest Management of the Forest Engineering Department, under the general coordination of Professor Gilciano Saraiva Nogueira.

The main objective of the event was to promote the exchange, discussion and dissemination of scientific and practical knowledge among professionals in the area of Forest Mensuration, linked to the various educational, research and extension institutions in Brazil.

Counting with the participation of the most renowned specialists in the country and representatives from forest companies, the MENSUFLOR had an audience of approximately 180 people, including speakers, organizers, professionals and students from 19 Brazilian states.

The key issues discussed were:

- * Historical context of the Brazilian forest mensuration
- * Use of artificial intelligence in forest measurement
- Mixed effect models applied in studies of growth and yield
- Forest planning optimized for obtaining multiproduct wood
- Theoretical and practical aspects of sampling to quantify necromass forest (standing dead fallen wood or biomass)
- Use of randomized branch sampling to estimate timber and non-timber forest
- * Forest carbon inventory and measurement systems for commercial timber in logs



During the dinner that was offered to the participants, Professors Francisco Paula Neto and João Carlos Chagas Campos from the Federal University of Viçosa (UFV), and Professors Sebastião do Amaral Machado and Sylvio Péllico Neto from the Federal University of Paraná (UFPR) were honored for their pioneer performances in the area of Forest Mensuration and relevant services to the teaching, research and extension in Brazil.

The meeting provided participants with an opportunity to update and exchange professional knowledge and helped to strengthen contacts between the Brazilian forest mensuration experts, given the excellent quality and innovative themes of the lectures, and the high level of knowledge and experience of the researchers. Consequently, it was decided to hold MENSUFLOR meetings every other year from now on, with the next meeting scheduled for the second semester of 2014 in the state of Curitiba, under the responsibility of UFPR.

12th International IUFRO Wood Drying Conference

Challenges and Opportunities Related to Tropical Lumber Drying

The city of Belém, capital of the state of Pará in the equatorial north of Brazil, hosted the 12th International IUFRO Wood Drying Conference (WDC 2012) from July 30 to August 3, 2012.

This first WDC in South America offered a great opportunity to learn about tropical rainforest species and visit the exuberant Amazon forest. There is growing concern around the world, and especially in Brazil, about the sustainable use of natural resources from tropical forest, and wood drying is an important factor for adding value to that wood.

Amongst other things, drying experts at the conference proposed methods to reduce drying losses, moisture content variability, energy consumption, and emission of volatile organic compounds. Special importance was given to explain government programs that promote a sustainable use of the Brazilian rainforest. 80 participants from 14 countries had the opportunity to attend 28 oral presentations and read 31 posters covering 7 general topics:

- * Drying Quality and Wood Properties
- * Methods for Monitoring the Drying Process
- Physics of Wood Drying and Modeling
- * Applied Wood Drying
- Alternative Drying Methods
- Wood Modification Related to Drying
- * Miscellaneous Drying Technologies

Three wood drying experts that are well connected to the Brazilian forest sector delivered the conference keynotes:

Ivan Tomaseli (Brazil): Challenges and opportunities related to tropical lumber drying

Patrick Perré (France): Energy consumption during lumber drying

Marcus Vinícius Alves (Brazil): Forest concession in Brazil and the supply of tropical lumber

Government officials from the state of Pará, Brazil, talked about their experiences in sustainable use and conservation of natural resources through two government programs: Public Forests Management program; Green Cities program.

Delegates had the chance to participate in three technical visits to the local industry and learn about wood species, manufacturing processes and finished products: Ebata Produtos Florestais (wood flooring) Pampa Exportações Ltda. (wood flooring) Tramontina (furniture)

The WDC is an international IUFRO wood drying conference regularly held every 2 years since 1987. The WDC has been proven to be an invaluable opportunity for wood drying researchers worldwide to gather during 4 to 5 days and share their experiences and results. Furthermore, it has also proven to be a nice opportunity to meet old friends and make new ones!

Impacts of Extreme Weather on Natural, Socio-economic, and Land-use Systems

A NASA science meeting and workshop on "Impacts of extreme weather on natural, socio-economic, and landuse systems: Focus on the 2010 summer anomaly in the Volga region" were organized to examine the extreme drought which occurred in most of European Russia in 2010.

For this joint event of NASA, Global Observations of Forest and Land Cover Dynamics (GOFC-GOLD) program, and the Northern Eurasia Earth Science Partnership Initiative (NEESPI), 78 scientists from the US, Europe, Russia, and Kazakhstan gathered in Yoshkar-Ola, Russia from June 17-22, 2012 to develop a comprehensive view of the 2010 drought and its impacts on ecosystems and society.

The meeting was held at the Volga State University of Technology (Volga Tech) and was supported by contributions from the Global Change SysTem for Analysis Research and Training (START) program and ScanEx Research and Development Center and with information support from Sovzond, European Forest Institute and the IUFRO.

Meeting participants concluded that the scientific community has built a solid basis by summarizing the biophysical conditions that led to the development of extreme drought of 2010 and observing the direct impacts of drought on forested and agricultural systems. However, there is a need for more research to enhance our understanding of the impacts and explore approaches for the mitigation of similar events in the future.

Thus, a scientific synthesis activity aimed at exploring interdisciplinary connections and feedbacks and linking the observed biophysical conditions to economic and health impacts involving international, national, and regional participants would be highly beneficial.

In addition to the scientific advances, such a synthesis activity would aid in building a regional network connecting academic and management institutions of the Volga region to facilitate scientific support for decision making.
