John Parrotta, Ph.D. (Yale University)



John has been active in IUFRO since 1993, when he became the coordinator of a newly established Division 1 Working Party on tropical forest restoration. Since that time he has served in a many IUFRO positions, including Deputy Coordinator and Coordinator of Division 1 (Silviculture), Deputy Coordinator of Division 8 (Forest Environment), Chair of the 2010 and 2014 World Congress Scientific Committees, Coordinator of IUFRO's Task Force on Traditional Forest Knowledge (2005-2010), Chair of the Collaborative Partnership on Forests' Global Forest Expert Panel on Biodiversity, Forest Management, and REDD+ (2012) and member of two other GFEP panels. He has been a member of the IUFRO Management Committee since 2006, and currently serves as Vice-President for Task Forces, Special

Programmes, Projects and IUFRO-led Initiatives.

John holds a B.A. in Biology and B.S. in Chemistry from Merrimack College (in Massachusetts, USA), an M.Sc. in Ecology from the University of Aberdeen (Scotland, UK), and a Ph.D. from Yale University. He has been involved in research worldwide for over 30 years, with particular interests in tropical forest ecology, biodiversity conservation, ecology and management of planted forests, forest restoration, forest history, and traditional forest knowledge. He is the author of a number of books and over 150 other research publications, and serves as an editorial board member for several scientific journals, including *Restoration Ecology*, *Forest Ecology and Management*, the *International Journal of Biodiversity Science and Management*, and *Global Environment*.

In his role as national program leader for international science issues with the U.S. Forest Service R&D branch, John provides scientific advice for U.S. government policy positions in international forest policy forums, and contributes to international programs and initiatives related to forest science and sustainable forest management.
