WFSE Side Event at XIV World Forestry Congress, Durban: Opportunities and challenges for harnessing local forest management to improve rural livelihoods in Africa

The WFSE Side Event took place during the first day of the congress 7th September. It focused on challenges and opportunities to enhance rural incomes and livelihoods from forest or trees. The presentations highlighted common elements to draw some general conclusions on the opportunities to improve rural incomes from forests and trees, and to identify challenges that are shared across the continent.
