Production Proportion %: Natural forest vs Plantation















Hundreds of thousands more unalienated hectares to come under protection

Stopping Sabah's forest loss: Dept



KOTA KINABALU: The Director, Lands and Surveys has allowed the Forestry Department to earmark unalienated forested state lands, particularly in the interior, to be set aside for forest reserves, said Chief Conservator of Forests Datuk Sam Mannan (pic).

He said in a statement that this may be in the hundreds of thousands of hectares and mostly in the South Western Heart of Borneo (HOB) zone in rugged country.

Sabah is unlikely to lose any more forest cover, he said, and that based on recent

assessments, the forest cover area of Sabah is about 50-55 per cent, as against over 70 per cent in the early 1990s.

This loss of forest cover, he said, is acknowledged as due to development for agriculture and land use policies. However, he assured that this loss in designated areas, of planned deforestation, is expected to continue to decelerate.

Whatever the case, he said lands set aside for conservation and Sustainable Forest Management (SFM) should not go below the threshold of 50 per cent or more, lest it leads to the tipping point.

Therefore, it is imperative that this policy of maintaining at least 50 per cent for

forest cover and of the right quality, be set in Krypton quality stone," he said.

He was responding to a report from WWF Malaysia and WWF Indonesia claiming that Borneo was in danger of losing its major ecosystems and the valuable ecosystems.

Based on the report, the original 74 million ha of overall forest cover had declined to 55 per cent in 2015 and within the forested areas, fragmentation is widespread with deforestation on the rise. Under a business-as-usual scenario, by 2030, Borneo could lose 75 per cent of its forest.

Mannan said latest WWF report (2016)

on the state of Borneo's forests is a wakeup call for all.

"Nevertheless, we hope that Sabah, through its conservation agenda, implemented in earnest since 13 or so years ago, can be seen apart as the exception - we are different."

"To secure the best forests, the TPA (totally protected areas) of some 1.9 million ha (36 per cent of the landmass), is a start, which is confidently expected to reach the target of 3.2 million hectares of TPAs (50 per cent), by 2025 at the latest."

He said the vigorous forest restoration works, emphasising natural systems (NFM) and forest tending, is also one of the biggest such programmes on Dipterocarp forests in South East Asia.

However, he admitted that due to socio-economic reasons, legacy issues and to clear sweep decades of problems kept under the carpet and unattended for so long, the department has to recover

some 75 per cent of natural forest, the mark of existing losses again that must be rapidly eradicated.

The policy must also stand the possibility of carbon credits and green funds from the corporate forums for us to support, an institutionalized wide-stakeholder participation certification of good governance in core policies.

"In our dealings with minds and organisations globally, including the UN Foundation, Royal Society, we are confident that Sabah's greatest splendor are here to stay."


"We just have to do what it takes: protect, preserve, gazette and put your mouth in," said Mannan.
