Innovation and Challenges in Bio-based Composites

The 9th Pacific Rim Bio-Based Composites Symposium cosponsored by IUFRO <u>5.00.00</u> and <u>5.05.00</u> returned to its roots when it was held in Rotorua, New Zealand from 5 - 8 of November, 2008. The inaugural Symposium in this series was launched in Rotorua in 1992. The event under the theme of "Innovation and Challenges in Bio-based Composites – How Far to the New Frontier?" had a good international representation, with almost three quarters of the attendees coming from outside New Zealand.

Life Cycle Workshop

The main Symposium was preceded by a one day workshop that focused on Life Cycle Assessment and how Life Cycle Thinking can stimulate lateral solutions for environmental problems. Workshop attendees worked through case studies and examples in groups, which demonstrated how as researchers we can use a range of options to innovate beyond what we perceive as the initial problem.

The pre-symposium workshop was concluded with two presentations from North American speakers who gave perspectives on how North America is tackling environmental solutions for wood-based products. Paul Smith from Pennsylvania State University focused on how North American resin manufacturers are seeing formaldehyde emissions as the largest single environmental issue they need to address, while Mike Wolcott from Washington State University looked at the role of 'Green Building' standards or certification and how wood may play a role in Green Buildings of the future.

Looking at new technologies from different angles

The four keynote speakers gave different, complementary perspectives on bio-based composites. Mike Wolcott reviewed technologies used in wood plastic composites (WPC), and gave an excellent overview of the wider aspects of sustainability, such as function, life and design for deconstruction that must be considered to have truly sustainable materials and products.

Chris van Kooten from Dynea spoke about the role of a commercial adhesive supplier in wood-based composites, while Paul Smith looked at mechanisms by which new technologies, with a focus on WPCs, obtain market penetration and a 'tipping point' in growth occurs.

Philip Evans from the University of British Columbia demonstrated his world leading research by showing results of an integrated X-ray micro-computed tomography (CT) analysis of UF resin distribution in 3-D through particleboard.

Observations in this work led to the conclusion that significant resin migration across wood particles occurs during the hot pressing of the panel.

Interesting data on panel manufacturing and hot pressing

After an intensive exchange of information on latest developments in the fields of adhesives, fibre reinforced plastics, volatile organic compounds and reconstituted panel products, a plenary session wound up the Symposium.

A revealing overview of the diversity in panel manufacturing facilities in China was followed by a presentation showing some interesting results from including essential oils in panel manufacture.

The final presentation covered the complex physical and chemical phenomena that occur in the composite hot pressing process. Interesting data were presented which suggested that marked increases in bond strengths could potentially be achieved through the implementation of cooling stages in the pressing process.

Next symposium

Feedback from delegates indicated that the 9th Pacific Rim Bio-Based Composites Symposium was a success. It was announced that Canada would be the host for the 10th symposium in the series. The organizing committee of the 9th symposium would like to wish Rob Wellwood and his team every success for the 10th Symposium which will be held in Banff in 2010.

Scientific Achievement Award (SAA)

Up to 10 awards will be given in recognition of distinguished individual scientific achievements within the fields of research covered by IUFRO. Criteria for judgment will include dissemination of results, implementation of findings, methods or techniques in practical forestry and skilled research management (success in publications, meetings, funding, etc. in a larger group than the individual) and involvement in IUFRO activities.

Outstanding Doctoral Research Award (ODRA)

One award per IUFRO Division will be given to recognize outstanding individual scientific achievements among young Doctoral researchers and to encourage further work within the fields of research covered by the Union.

IUFRO Student Award for Excellence in Forest Sciences (ISA)

One award per IUFRO Division will be given to recognize outstanding individual achievements in forest science made by Masters degree students (or equivalent), and to encourage their further work within the fields of research covered by the Union. Nominations can be made through IUFRO Member Organizations or officeholders and through members of the International Forestry Students Association (IFSA).

IUFRO World Congress 2014: Last Call for Bidding

IUFRO Member countries interested in bidding for the XXIV World Congress of IUFRO to be convened in 2014, should be aware of the bidding schedule as outlined below. The bidding guidelines can be found at:

By December 31, 2008: Proposals are due to the IUFRO Secretariat, for the MC's review. The MC analyzes proposals and ranks up to three best applications for further consideration.

By April 30, 2009: Countries submitting best bids would be invited to present to the Board at its October 2009 meeting detailed documents and slide/video show on the venue and facts of the Congress 2014. The Board votes for the best candidate. As a next step, the Board receives an agreement between IUFRO and the recommended host country that outlines respective responsibilities for finances, facilities, and services.

By June 30, 2010: A recommendation for Congress site and date, and rationale for approval, is forwarded to the International Council.

By August 27, 2010: Formal announcement of the XXIV IUFRO World Congress site and proposed date is made by the International Council.

Biodiversity in Forest Ecosystems and Landscapes

This international conference was sponsored by IUFRO Research Group 8.02 'Forest Biodiversity" and took place from 5-8 August 2008 at Thompson Rivers University in Kamloops, in the interior of British Columbia, Canada.

This stimulating and most memorable meeting was hosted by Thompson Rivers University, British Columbia Ministry of Forests and Range, British Columbia Ministry of Environment, and Forrex, under the leadership of Alan Vyse, André Arsenault, Tom Dickinson, Walt Klenner and many other local organizing committee members.

Nearly 100 participants from 16 countries gathered for this meeting to discuss a wide range of forest biodiversity and conservation issues, monitoring of forest biodiversity at different spatial scales, biodiversity and forest ecosystem functioning, forest management impacts on biodiversity, ecosystem goods and services, and numerous other forest biodiversity conservation issues.

Almost all of the ponderosa pine trees in the area were killed in 2006 during a mass attack by the mountain pine beetle.

Climate change impacts were also discussed, and the venue provided an ideal backdrop for this with the recent outbreak of the mountain pine beetle which is thought to be partly caused by a series of unusually mild winters. Several long-term forest research sites in the surroundings featured prominently in the conference program and in the field trips to various landscapes.

Nobel Prize winning scientist elected as future President of the International Council for Science

Professor Yuan Tseh Lee, a Nobel Prize winning chemist from China: Taipei has been elected as the future President of the International Council for Science (ICSU). A world leader in the field of chemical dynamics, Lee was elected by representatives from ICSU's 114 National Members and 29 International Scientific Unions at the 29th General Assembly in Maputo, Mozambique, 21–24 October. He will take up the appointment in April 2010 and will succeed the current ICSU President, Catherine Bréchignac, in October 2011. IUFRO as a member organization of ICSU would like to congratulate the incumbent president.

We are sad to inform you that former IUFRO Vice-President **Douglas Redmond** from Canada passed away on 29 October 2008 in his 91st year.

Doug Redmond had dedicated his life to leading the Canadian Forestry Service in maintaining and preserving the Canadian forest industry through the promotion of conservation, preservation and reforestation measures. He represented Canada at the international level to spearhead the preservation of the world's forests and, for his efforts, received an Honorary Membership in IUFRO in 1976.

From 1961-1971 Doug Redmoond had been Member of the IUFRO Permanent Committee and from 1972-1976 he served as Vice-President of IUFRO. As Chairman of the Programme Committee he contributed most significantly to the active work of IUFRO during the first period after IUFRO's reorganization, when the new divisions and research groups had to find their way.
