1. Background

Population migration from rural to urban area is popular phenomena around the world. In the early and mid 20th century, Asian countries have been experiencing common problems such as rapid urbanization coupled with rural exodus due to occidental civilization and institutions. Rapid urbanization has been accompanied with declining traditional knowledge and culture transcended at rural community from generation to generation. This conference has a focus to identify the value of forest related traditional knowledge being utilized at rural area in Asia, and to suggest alternative way of modernized people in urban area. Especially, an example of such forest-related traditional knowledge is based on village common woodlands located within and around villages in Asia. This meeting will contribute not only the finding common process from rural to urban community, also discovering regional specific process related with regional political, social and religion characteristics in Asia.

During last century, what kinds of nature did we lose? What kinds of humanity has disappeared?

In the course of retrospection of this enormous change last century, we can discuss a clue and new horizon between forest and village toward future generation in Asia.

- 3. Traditional knowledge of forest products, including wood and non-wood products, food materials, fodder and medicine, housing and fuel wood
- 4. Traditional knowledge of environmental functions of forests in relation to water supply, soil conservation and climate regulation
- 5. Urban ecological restoration based on traditional knowledge
- 6. Change of agroforestry systems at rural landscape
- 7. Policy issues relating to forests and traditional knowledge and culture
