Location: IUFRO All-Division 9 Conference takes place in Hotel Hollywood (Dr. Pintola 23 Ilidža, 71000 Sarajevo, Bosnia-Herzegovina) that provides an excellent conference venue with high quality conference rooms and facilities, excellent accommodation, and all meals during the week. There are fitness facilities on site including: large indoor swimming pool, exercise equipment, sauna, and running/walking paths nearby.

Accommodation:

You must make your hotel registration individually on the hotel web page: (http://www.hotel-hollywood.com.ba/index_en.htm). For accommodation please indicate your participation in IUFRO All-Division 9 Conference.

Cost per participant is 62 Euros per day for a single room and 47 Euros per day for a double room. This includes: accommodation, all meals during the seminar except the Official Dinner/Farewell Party on Friday, one drink per meal, 1 coffee during the break and drinking water during the Conference. Deadline for online accommodation booking is **April 1st** 2012. After this date, we cannot guarantee the conference prices and conditions in the hotel.

Transportation: In order to facilitate your transport from/to airport Sarajevo, please provide the local organizers with your travel itinerary. Sarajevo Airport is only 10 minutes away and so transportation is easily arranged. Should you decide to take a taxi from the airport, please be advised that the rate should be no more than 5 Euros (the taxis waiting outside the airport are unregulated and often demand much more). Ideally, we are happy to organize transportation for you to the hotel. For site-seeing, the historic city of Sarajevo is easily accessible by tram or taxi.
